

Wildcats, Gators Play for Loop Flag

DICKINSON, May 13 — The high school baseball squads of Dickinson and Clear Creek will move into neutral territory Tuesday to decide the championship of district 19-A when they move into Alvin.

Each team let the title slip through their fingers during the past week when Clear Creek fell to Angleton and Dickinson dropped its chance to Deer Park.

Each ended the season with 7-3 marks.

Expected to start from the Gators is junior Tommy (Red) Stewart, the versatile right hander who doubles at any position on the infield and does most of the catching, with Van Huckaby snaring his

slants. A surprise starter may be either Huckaby or fast balling Frank Emmite.

Coach Jack Porter had no commitments.

For Dud Kelly's Wildcats, Jerry Brizindine will probably get the call due to his effectiveness with a variety of pitches.

This is Dickinson's first attempt in the higher bracket Interscholastic League competition. For the past three years, operating in the lower class B division which only permitted the team to go as far as regional, the Gators copped the title, twice going undefeated for the season.

A win for either school will send the titlist into state district competition next week.
