

GATORS WIN IN BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

Coach Jack Porter's Dickinson Gators won the Dickinson-Clear Creek baseball tourney held Friday and Saturday defeating Clear Creek in the final game.

Alvin defeated La Marque 13 to 3 to take third place in the meet while Deer Park won consolation honors downing Ft. Worth Tech 9 to 2.

The Gators now have a season record of nine wins and one loss.

In their first game Coach Porter's boys beat Santa Fe 7 to 0. Van Huckaby limited the Indians to two hits, while Ronnie Clark led the Gators at the plate with two hits.
