

Coach Doug Reid's Gator track men did a very fine job at the 6th Annual Alvin Relays, as they took third place as a team in a field of 23 squads. Pole vaulter Kenny Payne took first place and set a new meet record

at 14' 3" and Clarence Farmer added two points with a fifth place finish. David Mackey got second in the discus for eight points; and the Gators showed real strength in the 800 yard dash as Ronnie Bimage took first place with a time of 2:02.4; Carl Barnett was third in 2:07.3; and at 2:08.9, Robert Briggs took sixth to have all three entries finish "in the money." Carl Ables placed fifth in the open 440 yard dash for two more Gator points. Blair Korndorffer took a good fourth place finish in the 330 yard intermediate hurdles for four more points. The Gator foursome of Kilmitte Scott, James Barnett, Oscar Jenkins, and Ronnie Bimage teamed to hit 8:18.7 and take first place and 20 points in the two-mile relay. In the 440 yard relay, Jesse Rollins, Harvey Criswell, Don Luedecke, and Gary Young took fifth place. The Gators rounded out their scoring with a third place finish in the mile relay on the running of Blair Korndorffer, Carl Ables, James Taylor, and Ronnie Bimage.

In the girl's division of the Alvin Relays, Coach Brenda Brown's team found that two track meets in as many days was too much, but still performed well. Vera Praylor took fourth place in the 50 yard dash; the foursome of Vera Praylor, Linda Spriggins, Sherri Jenkins, and Anita Taeuber placed fourth in the 880 yard relay; Anita Taeuber was fifth in the open 440 dash; and Sherri
