The band performed a precision drill to the music of Porter's Catalina March, March Graindoso and Soul Step.

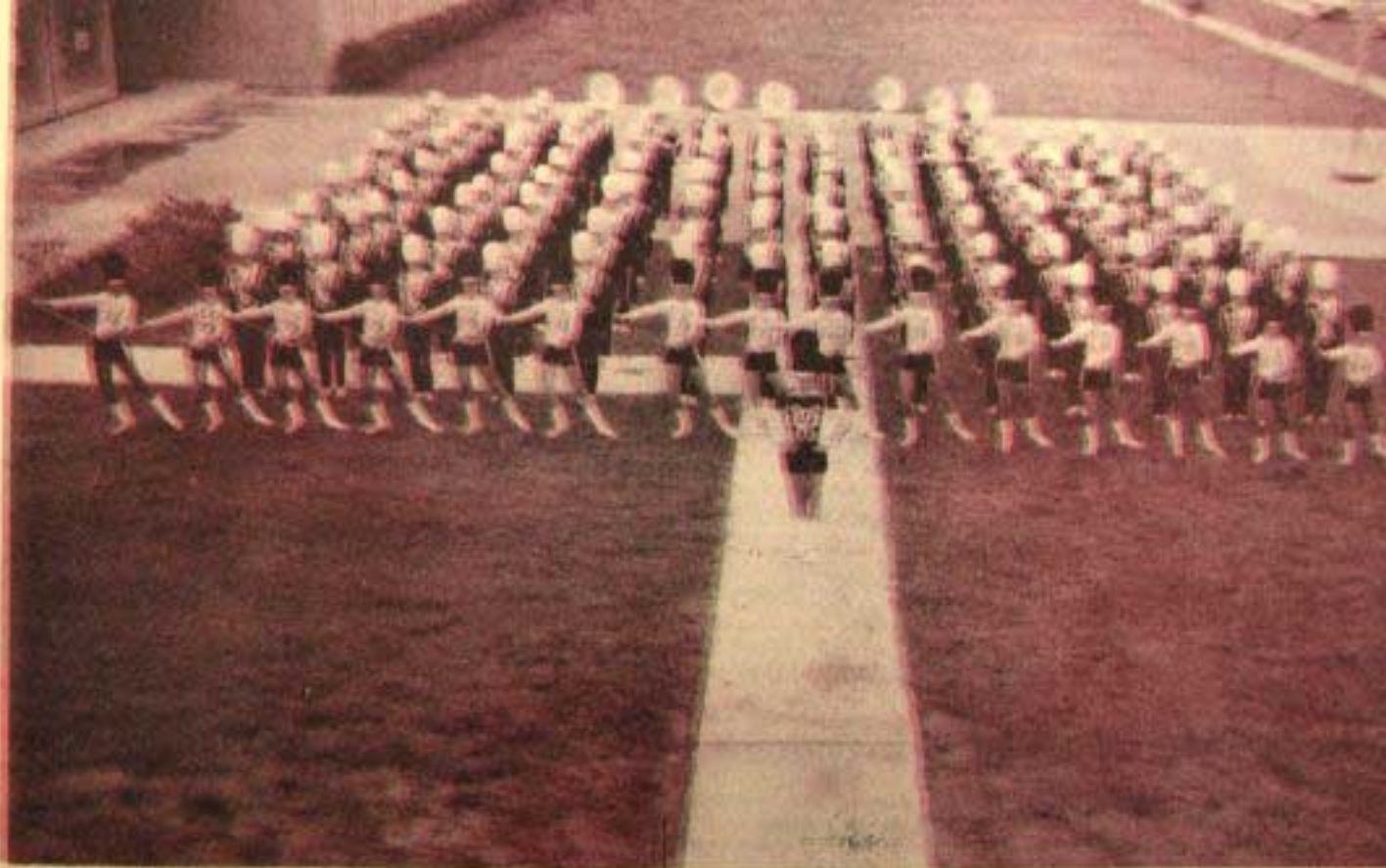
