Dickinson Bands Bring Top Atlanta Honors

High School Symphonic and
Concert Bands returned Sunday night from a four-day trip
to the Atlanta, Georgia, Band
Festival and brought home top
band honors.

The Symphonic Band, directed by Gus Nelson, won 1st division awards from all three judges at the contest. In addition the Symphonic Band was given the "Honor Band" trophy at the festival in recognition for the most outstanding band it its class.

The Concert Band, directed by Don Wilkins, also won a 1st division award and its performance was covered by Channel 2 T. V. in Atlanta.

The festival was sponsored by the Six Flags Over Georgia Corporation, and judges for the event were Dr. William Revelli from the University of Michigan, William Swor from Louisiana State University and Al Wright from Purdue University.
