

Dickinson DE Rolls Swelling

DICKINSON — A. C. Hollinger, coordinator of the Distributive Education program in the Dickinson High School reported Tuesday that enrollment in the program will exceed that of last year, the first year in which the DE program was included in the curriculum of the Dickinson High School.

Distributive Education classes are a means for a student to get practical training in business while going to school. One hour of DE is taught each day, in addition to the basic studies on the junior and senior level, according to Hollinger.

In the classes and in the work done by the students, the many facets of competitive business are learned. All students must be employed part time, at least 15 hours weekly in order to qualify for the program.

Last year 33 students were in the program. This year Hollinger said that he expects from 40-50 enrolled in the class. He is now interviewing prospective employers and students and there are some 14 girls entered in the program still needing jobs to qualify for the courses. Students usually work at their jobs from 1:30 p.m. on, attending DE and solid basic junior and senior classes during the morning hours.
