

Dirty Work At Drama Department At High School

DICKINSON—The Dickinson High School Thespian Society got its wheels rolling when Director George Parks unlocked the auditorium doors to cast the play, Dirty Work at the Crossroads, a gay nine-ties melodrama written by Bill Johnson. The play will be presented on December 4, 5, and 6 at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium. Tickets are \$1 for students and \$1.25 for adults.

The curtain opens on Adam Oakhart, portrayed by Mike Doherty, and Nellie Lovelace, played by Debbie Magruder. Dicky Young is cast as Munro Murgatroyd, the cold villain. It is Munro's plan to murder Widow Lovelace, Sally Chapman, and marry Nellie Lovelace. But all is spoiled when Debbie Grubbs flounces in as Ida Rhinegold who was once Munro's wife. Ida then introduces her plan for Munro to marry Patrice McNeel who is cast as Leonie Asterbilt, the rich daughter of Mrs. Asterbilt, Debbie Hime. Again plans are disrupted when Mrs. Asterbilt tries to kill Ida Rhinegold. Mary Jo Herranen plays the role of Fleurette. In between her French ooh-la-las's, she acts as maid for Mrs. Asterbilt. While everything is a big mess, Nellie has help from Dennis Gallaher who portrays the part of Mookie, a naive country boy.

Before things are streightened out, Nancy Roeser pops in as Little Nell, the little girl without a father.
