For School Bonds.

A petition bearing fifty-nine signatures of taxpayers of Common School District No. 7, at Dickinson, requested that the board call an election within the district for the purpose of voting \$15,000 school bonds with which to purchase land and erect a brick school building. The bonds are to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent and are to run for a period of twenty years, with option to redeem them at the end of ten years.

The board referred to County Attorney Theobald the question of a date for the election.

Commissioner Deats said that the wooden building at Dickinson was to be replaced by a brick structure to meet the growing demands of the school district.
