Dickinson, Tex., Sept. 15.—The Dickinson high school opened its doors Monday, Sept. 12, to 412 students with others yet to come in. All books were issued and registration completed on the first day.

The school now has 24½ credits of affiliation, having added units in physical education and biology to the accredited list during the past year.

The Dickinson High School Band organized last year will resume its work again this year under the direction of Conway Shaw of Galveston.

For the first time in history the school is to have a football team. The boys have been working daily with Norman Moller, the coach. Complete uniforms and equipment have been bought for the entire group.

Due to the increase in enrollment it has become necessary for the second grade class to be held in the Dickinson Community Club building this year under the supervision of Miss Clarite Lansford and Miss Mildred Eldridge. The first grade class will continue to study in the primary building with Miss Anna Montgomery and Miss Margaret Brown as the teachers. Besides those already mentioned the faculty includes: E. M. Belcher, superintendent; O. J. Baker, principal and commercial work; third grade, Miss Grace Lewis; fourth grade, Mrs. Sam Termini; fifth grade, Miss Lillian Hoffman; sixth grade, Miss Alice Buchanan; seventh grade, Raymond Gillis. High school: Home economics, Miss Anna Margaret Fowler; English, Miss Florence Kendrick; mathematics and science, R. J. Eownds; social science and coach, Norman Moller; Girls' physical education and librarian, Miss Frieda Smith.

The teachers reception given by the PTA will be held Friday, Sept. 16, at 8 p. m. at the high school auditorium. A program and dancing will be the main diversion of the evening. At this time the Veterans of Foreign Wars will present the school with an American flag.
