PROPOSED EDUCATIONAL CENTER FOR DICKINSON HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS



The sketch above, furnished by Jones & Tabor of Houston, architects and engineers, shows the proposed educational plant for Dickinson high school students, which along with construction of a new negro elementary and high school building would cost approximately \$250,000. Qualified voters of Galveston County common school district No. 7, which includes Dickinson, will vote on a proposed \$100,000 bond issue Saturday, Aug. 20, which would be added to a \$112,000 PWA grant already applied for to finance the construction program.

The old Dickinson High School building would be used as an elementary school. Plans are to build the new negro school on the site of the present negro school building.

At left foreground in the picture above is the proposed cafeteria and home economics building. Behind the home economics building is the proposed manual arts building. The building in the center of the drawing will house seven classrooms and school administrative offices. At right foreground is the proposed school auditorium, and behind it is a gymnasium. A proposed athletic field and track is shown in the background.
