

Homer Moore Key Man In 20-0 Tomball Win

Dickinson, Sept. 10.—Tomball's Cougars, relegated to the lower B bracket in the interscholastic league shuffle, had reason enough to chuckle today.

They stepped over one of the uppity Class A members, Dickinson's Gators, Thursday night, in a nonconference game before some 1200 fans.

Moore Best Back

Held scoreless in the opening half, the Cougars unleashed a three-touchdown attack in the final two quarters to win, 20-0.

The best ball carrier on the field turned out to be Tomball's

Homer Moore. The little speedster chugged 80 yards for a touchdown in the opening period only to see it nullified because of a holding penalty.

Again in the third quarter Moore smashed over from the four-yard line to cap a 70-yard drive, but the penalty bugaboo cropped up again. But Moore was not to be denied. After his team mate Millard Ford pushed to the 10, Moore swept right end for the first touchdown. Carl Maglitto passed to Johnny Whitehead for the point after.

Ford raced 42 yards through the tiring 'Gators early in the third

for the second score and Maglitto hit Charles Kuehn with the point after pass attempt.

Tomball's Johnny Davis, a former Dickinson boy, horned most of the honors in the third touchdown. He intercepted a 'Gator pass on the Dickinson 25, slammed tackle twice to the 18 and then showed his heels the rest of the way.

Gators Threaten Once

The 'Gators threatened once in the opening minutes when Gene Myers recovered a Tomball fumble on the Cougar 35. Charlie Griffith punched out a first down to the Tomball 20 and that was it. Tomball stiffened and stayed rough the rest of the way.

Jackie Mackey and Dave Bergeron led the Dickinson defense while Moeller and Kuehn sparked the well-balanced Tomball front wall.
