The Gators got two breaks in the second half and capitalized on both of them.

Willie Walker recovered a Sweeney fumble on the Bulldog 15-yard stripe. Johnny Blackman danced his way through a horde of Sweeney tacklers for 14 yards and the score. Jackey Mackey skirted right end for the conversion attempt to make it 7-0, Dickinson.

In the final period, End Raymond Anders intercepted a Bulldog toss and went 38 yards unmolested. Paul White's end-around attempt failed on the conversion, to make it Dickinson 13, Sweeney 0.

Sweeney missed a gold opportunity late in the first half, when a fumble on the Gator 10-yard line spoiled their deepest penetration of the evening.

Sweeney dominated most of the first-half play on the wet gridiron, but the Guy Nunnally-coached Gators found the mud to their liking in the late stages of the game, and won going away.
