

Webster Nips Gators

Dickinson, Sept. 23.—A slow-starting Webster Wildcat team overtook an early seven-point deficit to edge out a game Dickinson eleven on the strength of I. B. Buckley's field goal in the third quarter before some 2000 fans.

It was superior weight and better ball-handling that enabled Webster to dominate the final three quarters as the Gators hung on in this District 25-A tilt.

After Dickinson took the kick-off and both teams exchanged punts, Dickinson struck fast with

to score and I. B. Buckles converted after a drive sparked by McFarland, Fullback Leonard Priest and Quarterback Frankie Kagawa.

Late in the second quarter, the Wildcat sparkplug, Kagawa, was injured as the 115-pound quarterback slammed into a Dickinson ball carrier. Leaving the game, he was back again midway through the third quarter to lend a 76-yard march.

Racking up five successive first downs, the Wildcats marched down the field only to be stalled as the Gator line led by M. Kuhl on the Dickinson four. From that point, Buckles booted one through the uprights to send the visiting team ahead and end the scoring for the night.
