

Don Combs Leads Webster to Victory

DICKINSON, Sept. 17 — Donald Combs, a 163-pound whirling dervish halfback for the Webster Wildcats, sparked his team to a 39-0 victory over Dickinson here Friday night.

Had it not been for Combs, it would have been a fairly even ball game. But as it turned out, the speedy, powerful left half completely dominated the game and gave Webster the spark it needed for victory.

Combs gathered in a punt in the first quarter and raced 67 yards for the first tally of the game. Garvis Hadley kicked the extra point.

In the second quarter, Combs broke loose and rambled 30 yards around left end for a touchdown. Hadley's kick was no good.

Billy Frost accounted for the next touchdown on a 43-yard scamper and that made it 19-0 at the half.

Dickinson dominated the third quarter. Hershel Hughes and Johnny Tidwell alternated in totting the ball downfield. A pass to David Brown put the ball on the six and two plays later Jerry

Mitchner cracked over from the one — Brown's kick was blocked. In the fourth, Combs went to work again. He made a 47-yard run to paydirt but it was called back because of a penalty. After

the penalty he rambled 51 yards to the one and on the next down he bulled over for the touchdown.

A 69-yard burst through left guard accounted for Combs' next touchdown. Harry Christy then wound up scoring on a five-yard smash and Hadley kicked goal.

Jackie Tarpley, Melvin Cavallia and Apolonio Rios were outstanding on defense for Dickinson while Jerry McDannald and Beaulé Wilkening shone for Webster along with — of course — Combs.
