

# Dogs Nip Dickinson In Fourth Quarter

DICKINSON, Oct. 14—Sweeney quarterback Ronnie Pinckard sneaked over from the one-yard line with a minute and eight seconds left in the game here Friday night to give the Bulldogs a 12-7 District 26-A victory over Dickinson.

The final tally came just after Dickinson had scored to take a 7-6 lead in the last period. Pinckard's plunge capped a 50-yard drive.

Dickinson was making its first start of the season in district play.

The defeat left the Gators with a 2-3 record for the year. It was the first win, against a single loss in district competition for the Bulldogs.

The two clubs fought to a scoreless draw in the first half, with both moving the ball well between the 20 yard lines. Dickinson ends Tommy Stewart and Alton Nowlin repeatedly broke through to throw Sweeney ball carriers for losses.

Sweeney drove inside the Dickinson 20 in the third period, only to have the drive stopped by a fum-

ble. After a two-yard gain through the line on the first play, Dickinson quarterback Butch Brown faded back and threw a flat pass. Buddy Hammond of the Bulldogs tipped the ball into the air, and teammate Johnel Allen grabbed it on the 22 and raced over for the game's first score. Bill Surber's extra point try was wide.

The Gators stormed back in the fourth quarter, with a 54-yard sprint by Brown tying the score with 3:15 left to play. Brown put the Gators ahead with his extra point kick.

But the Bulldogs weren't to be denied. With guard Gerald Linnette clearing the way for the thrusts of Eddie Neptune and Carl Broderhausen, Sweeney quickly travelled to the one to set up Pinckard's scoring play.
