

Santa Fe, Dickinson to Battle For Survival in 26A Campaign

ALTA LOMA, Oct. 20—Santa Fe, striving to keep its title hopes alive after having lost two district 26-A contests, will entertain the Dickinson Gators here at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Dickinson lost to Sweeney last Friday night while Santa Fe was losing to Deer Park. Deer Park defeated Sweeney earlier in the season.

J. W. Garrison, big Indian fullback, played a very good game on defense against Deer Park but was unable to break loose for any big yardage on offense. Clayton Carroll, 140-pound quarterback, made the only Santa Fe tally of the game when he rode behind the blocking of end Kenneth Maxwell and Garrison for 11 yards. Garrison literally ran over two Deer Park defenders to pave the way for Carroll's score.

The Gators and the Indians are rated about even for this contest.

Dickinson goes in search of its first district 26-A win and third victory of the season.

Coach Larry Mildren reported his team fit for action as the full 27 man squad completed workouts Thursday afternoon. Minor casualties in the 12-7 loss to Sweeney a week ago have healed.

In facing the gold and purple shirted Chiefs, Dickinson must be able to stop the hard charging ground game of J. W. Garrison, a natural born fullback.

The Gator overhead attack has been spotty to date but good enough to keep the opposition cautious. Hutch Brown, Mildren's man-under, has begun to make good use of the rollout from which he either pases or continues around end.

Worthy of note during the past

two games has been the play of 118-pound Homer Clarke. Used primarily on defense, he subbed in at halfback against Sweeney and did well enough to satisfy the coaching staff.

A probable starting lineup Friday could be Tommy Stewart at left end and Alton Nowlin on the port side. Four tackles, Larry Mildren, Wayne Hall, Jack Tarpley

and Jack-Stewart, will be paired off depending whether Dickinson receives or kicks off.

A pair of real watchcharm guards, Elmo Hunter and David Yates, will start with Freeman Moore or Lynes Cavillin at center.

Working with Brown will be halfbacks Gene McCoslin, Hershell or Lloyd Hughes, and Clarke.

A youngster who demonstrated that practice makes perfect, Jerry Atkins, gets the fullback assignment. A lineman until this year, Atkins made things miserable for the Bulldogs last week as they concentrated on Hershell Hughes.
