DICKINSON, Aug. 27 — The Dickinson High School football schedule will not be relieved at any point with breathers as far as high school teams go in this area due to head coach Bill Duncan's attitude toward a worthwhile goal—a championship club.

Duncan, who is also physical education director here, will be aided this season on the varsity by coaches Bernard Callender and Guy Broussard.

Junior high and B team members will be led by Woodrow Whatley, Charles Schroder and Preston Bullard. The lower grade teams go into action Monday. The varsity started its work last Monday with 47 hopefuls.

Dickinson has a 10-game schedule and six District 25 AA opponents. Channelview is a new member to the league this year having played the past few seasons in a league which was dominated by Deer Park in A ball.

Dickinson appears to be stronger in the line than last season and definitely has a good potential backfield. Juniors Eddie Hall, Robert Topfer and Kenneth Lee make the Gators strong in running and passing.

Deer Park, a usual perennial favorite for the state title, regardless of classification, is rebuilding this season under Shorty Hughes. La Porte threw a scare into the whole district with its 1958 brand of play while Angleton appears to be one of the toughest league teams.
