Campbell And Cheshire Shine For Gator II

DICKINSON, Sept. 15 — A pair of C's can add up to comparable achievement and the county's top winning football machine went to work Friday night to prove the point as the Dickinson Gators easily defeated Sweeny eleven, 24-6.

Dale Campbell gained 100 yards in 22 carries and tackle John Cheshire, helped hold the opposition to 79 yards.

Campbell gained 67 yards in 12 tries in the first half and averaged 3.3 in the second half. It was Cheshire who blocked Lindon Creel's punt with Kenneth Huckaby and Ronnie Clark recovering on the 38 yard line.

Dickinson backs Eddie Hall, Kenneth Lee, and Hugh Lee Simmons proved too fast for the Sweeny line.

Surprise package of the night was Jimmy Wedder, though continuing his defensive play like a demon, he showed signs as a replacement for Eddie Hall at half-back late in the game when the Gators had salted it away.

A big note in the Gator change since last year was the second unit's ability to hold on against goal line rushes.

To single out any standouts in the Gators two game winning streak would be impossible. However, Arthur Brannon, teaming with Cheshire at tackle, turned in his usually good game along with guards Ronnie Clark and Gary Atkins.

Dickinson engages Dayton Friday there. Dayton lost to Hull-Dalesetta last week. Some determination of late league standings may come this week end in District 25 AA as Humble meets Clear Creek. Dickinson easily subdued the Wildcats from Humble 34-12 and Humble in turn kayoed Livingston 28-0 last weekend. Liberty trounced Deer Park 13-0 and only measured La Porte 7-6 in two frays.
