

Kirwin, Gators, Cats Only Unbeaten County Grid Teams

Three county high school teams—Kirwin, Dickinson and Central—scored victories last week to take the role as the only unbeaten senior high football teams in the country.

The Dickinson Gators set the hot pace by posting their third victory of the season at the expense of Dayton, 22-0.

Kirwin's Buccaneers opened their season with a 22-6 decision

over the Santa Fe Indians while Central opened with a 12-6 victory over Waco Moore High.

Overall county high school teams fared better last week than the previous week. Last week five county teams came up with victories, while four were on the losing side. The previous week three county teams won while four suffered defeats.

Coach Joe Fertitta's Kirwin

Buccaneers try for their second victory this Friday night when they invade Hitchcock. Coach Charles Baker's Hitchcock team has a 1-1 record, getting a 27-15 victory over Santa Fe two weeks ago and losing to Barbers Hill, 16-13, last week.

In scoring their initial victory, the Buccaneers rolled up 318 yards rushing and 100 yards more on passes for a total offense of 418 yards. The total offense was the biggest rolled up of any county team last week.

Dickinson tries for its fourth straight victory Friday when the Gators host the Aldine Mustangs. Aldine downed Silsbee, 12-6, last Friday.

Ball High, smarting from two setbacks in as many tries, play their second home game Friday night against the Port Neches Indians, who belted Nederland, 36-22. Port Neches has two straight wins.

Ball's loss last Friday was a 6-0 decision to Beaumont South Park before a crowd of some 4,000 here in the Public School Stadium. The Tors outplayed South Park in just about everything but the final score.

Coach Orville Etheredge's La Marque Tigers hit the victory trail with a 22-0 decision over Bellville last Friday. Originally slated to be played in La Marque, the game was moved to Bellville because of the wet, soggy condition of the La Marque field.

Tigers play their first home game this Friday when they host West Columbia. The West Columbia team was humbled by Angleton, 24-0, last week.

Clear Creek goes to Liberty Friday. Clear Creek scored its second win against a single defeat last Friday beating Humble, 12-6.

Texas City, winless in two tries, has an open date this week.

Twice-beaten Santa Fe goes to Tidehaven Friday.

Central goes for its second win of the season when the Bearcats host Houston Worthing in a District 3-AAA opener here Thursday night.
