

Gator Win Streak Halted by Aldine #4

DICKINSON, Sept. 26. — Aldine's Mustangs, striking fast and furious for four first half touch-downs, ended the winning streak of the Dickinson Gators here Friday night by a 24-6 count.

The Gators, who had rolled over three straight foes in convincing fashion, were no match for the hard-charging Aldine boys. Aldine stayed on the ground and rolled up 343 yards to 117 for the Gators.

Dickinson's lone score came late in the second period. With two and a half minutes left in the first half, the passing of quarterback Eddie Hall and the running of halfback Kenny Lee moved the ball down to the Aldine 34. Lee carried to the 28 and then Hall ran to the 23-yard line.

Then Hall passed to Bobby Anderson for the score. Hugh Simmons failed in his attempt to run over the extra points.

Aldine rolled up 202 yards in the first half compared to the Gators' 56. After Aldine dominated the first two periods the Gators woke up during the second half and played their visitors on even terms but the score was made.

Early in the first period Hall punted to the Aldine eight after a Gator drive bogged down. Jerry Bellin of the Mustangs ran it out to his own 21. From there Aldine moved to their first score in 13 plays. Bellin took a hand-

off from the one to score but Jimmy Rice's conversion was blocked.

Dickinson fumbled the ensuing kickoff on their own 35 and Aldine recovered. This could have been the game's turning point for the Mustangs moved quickly to their second score. Quarterback Jack Hurlbut passed to end Garry LeBerge to the Gator 10 and Bellin took it over on the next play as the second quarter started. An attempted pass for the extra point failed.

Minutes later Aldine moved from their own 36 in six plays for another marker. Hurlbut passed to Rice off to the side and Rice stepped into the end zone. He then missed the conversion.

Dickinson took the ball but couldn't move. A punt went to Bellin and he promptly ran it back 46 yards for the Mustangs' final score of the night. Rice's kick went wide.

Next week the Gators host La Porte in an attempt to climb back into the victory column.
