## Lee Scores 3 Touchdowns, To Pace Dickinson Victory

DICKINSON, Oct. 17 - Kenneth Lee scored three touchdowns to boost his season scoring to 94 points in leading the Dickinson Gators to a 20-12 victory over the Clear Creek Wildcats here Friday night. The game was a District 25AA contest.

In posting their third straight district victory, the Gators knifed into paydirt just 58 seconds before halftime.
