

Deer Defeat Gators #8

DEER PARK, Oct. 24-Deer Park stayed an all-out rally in the last quarter here Friday night turned back the Dickinson Gators, 26-12, in a District 25-AA game.

While the defensive unit held Dickinson's Hugh Lee Simmons from doing any damage their offensive unit led by John Heath scored the needed points to assure Deer Park of an important victory.

Deer Park struck paydirt in the first quarter. Halfback Bobby Durrell raced 55 yards for six points to put his team out in front. Heath tried a pass for the extra point but failed to complete it.

In the second quarter neither team was able to get a drive started. But in the third period both team scored. Bobby Harrison taking the second half kickoff deep in Dickinson's territory re-43. Durrell took a lateral and ran 57 yards for the TD to give Deer Park a 12-6 lead.

In the final period Deer Park struck two times. Joe Arrington intercepted Eddie Hall's pass on the 50 and carried the ball to the turned the ball to Deer Park 47.

Then Simmons leading the way for the Gators, and a jump pass over center from Eddie Hall to

Deer Park took the kickoff following the touchdown and returned the ball from their 39 to

Gators' 10. On the second play from scrimmage Heath passed to George Stokes for the tally.

Dickinson, trying hard to get back into the game, scored their second touchdown. Fullback Dale Campbell and Simmons moved the ball from their 30 to Deer Park three and from that point Robert Topfer went over for the six points. But Deer Park came right back to score also. Heath tossed a long pass to Roger Emery good for 32 yards and Arrington on a handoff from the 12 went all the way. Heath went over for the two extra points.
