

# Angleton Topples Dickinson, 48 to 12 #9

DICKINSON, Oct. 31 — Quarterback Randy Curson paced the Angleton Wildcats to a 48-12 victory over the Dickinson Gators here Friday night. The victory cinches at least a tie for the district title for Angleton.

After a scoreless first period, Angleton scored early in the second period. John Ivy carried 41 yards to the one, and then Curson scored. He added the conversion from placement.

The Wildcats quickly scored again in the same period when

Mike Heffernan recovered a fumble on the Gator 37 to set up a touchdown drive. Angleton lost back to the 41. Then Curson fired a pass to Ivy for the 41 yards and the touchdown. Curson kicked the extra point.

Dickinson came back with a touchdown. The Gators drove 61 yards in nine plays. Eddie Hall scored from a yard out. Hall failed to run over the conversion.

The third Angleton touchdown came in the second period when a pass interference ruling gave

the Wildcats the ball on the Gator 26. Curson then passed to Bill Munson for the touchdown. The conversion kick failed.

At the start of the third period, Angleton used 12 plays to cover 57 yards. Curson passed to Bob Gustavsen for three yards and the score. Curson failed to run over the conversion.

Angleton scored again when Barry Kerr carried 12 yards to cap off a 41-yard drive. Curson kicked the conversion to give Angleton a 33-6 lead.

On the first play from scrimmage in the last period, Ivy went 49 yards to up Angleton's lead. Curson added the conversion kick.

Dickinson got its second touchdown in 10 plays covering 73 yards. Eddie Hall scored from 14 yards out. A pass for the conversion fell incomplete.

Angleton ended the scoring late in the period. Curson passed 13 yards to Gustasen on the two, from which point Curson scored one play later. Curson passed to Jim Bowles for the conversion to make the score 48-12.

Carolyn Sue Anderson was crowned Dickinson's homecoming queen. Helen Marie Whinkler was crowned football queen.
