# Santa Fe Gets Second Victory With 12-6 Win Over Dickinson

DICKINSON — The Santa Fe Indians with war paint and medicine working in two quarterbacks hatched out a 12-6 win over the Dickinson Gators here Friday night.

After being held scoreless in

the first quarter, the Indians gained a 6-0 lead, but the Gators slashed out and tied the game 6-6 at the half.

The Gators marched 73 yards in seven plays with a 24-yard pass from David Ford to Chuck Mills as the key play and Cecil Winzer's run of five yards for the TD.

Still in the second period the Indians chopped down their op-

ponents in 11 plays with the victory weapon being a six-yard pass from Johnny Greenough to Bill Caldwell to knot the score at 6-6.

Then in the third the Indians came forth with their new medicine weapon and chalked up six more points to go ahead and win the game, 12-6.

From their 23 the Indians went 77 yards in 15 plays which included two 15-yard penalties

against the Gators. With fourth down and the ball on the Gators' 11 the hard running Steve Tyler carried the pigskin to the opponents' one-yard line and from that spot Tim Christy bucked over for the six points.

The biggest setback for the Gators were penalties and the defensive work of the Indians as the home team penetrated the Santa Fe's 20-yard line five times.
