Wildcats Win 12th Straight

DICKINSON (Spl) — Clear Creek's Wildcats extended their victory streak to 12 straight — nine this season — with a 27-0 romp over the Dickinson Gators here Friday night in a District 12AAA game.

A crowd of about 4,000 fans, including 300 who walked the five miles from League City to Dickinson, saw the game.

Clear Creek with a 9-0 record to date will face Deer Park next Friday in League City in a game that will decide the District 12AAA championship.

After a scoreless first period, the Wildcats struck three times in the second quarter.

The first Clear Creek score came on a 54-yard drive that was covered in five plays. The

touchdown came on an 18-yard pass from quarterback Don Cope to end Johnny Valentino with 6:45 left in the period.

Halfback Tommy Sanders ran over the two extra points.

Stewart scored the next touchdown. This came when he intercepted a Dickinson pass and it was 36 yards into paydirt with 4:40 left before halftime.

A run for the extra points failed.

Dickinson failed to move after the ensuing kickoff and had to punt with Clear Creek taking over on the 50.

Two plays later the Wildcats scored. Both were big bombs. The first was a Cope to Valentino pass good for 17 yards. Then Sanders whipped around left end for the final 33 yards. The clock read 0:34 before the half.

An attempted pass for the extra points fell incomplete.

Clear Creek's final insurance touchdown came in the last period.

Dickinson was in a punt situation, but a bad pass from center allowed the Wildcats to take over on downs on the Dickinson 24.

Five plays later Cope passed

eight yards to halfback Larry Kelly on a fourth down play. Paul Hackett kicked the extra point with 6:06 left in the game.

Fullback Joe McKinney went 87 yards in the first period to the Gator six, but Dickinson's defense held. Hackett tried a field goal but it was off to the left.

The setback leaves Dickinson with a 1-8 season mark and a 6-4 district record.

McKinney was the leading gainer, picking up 120 yards on 11 carries.

Dickinson penetrated to the Wildcats, 13 in the first period, but this died when James McWhorter intercepted a Gator pass to kill the threat.
