

Rebounding Gators Go After Indians

DICKINSON - "Beat Santa Fe". So chanted coach Bill Ford's happy bunch of Dickinson Gators just minutes after their upset victory over Dulles last Friday night.

Dickinson will get its chance this Friday night at 8 p.m. at Gator Stadium when they take on the Indians from Alta Loma.

The tribe has been an on-again-off-again group, beating Friendswood, 39-0, and losing to Kirwin, 34-0, to Hitchcock, 12-0, and to Channelview in a close one, 15-9.

The Gators also have a 1-3 mark, getting their first win of the season last week.

The Dickinson defence shut the door on Dulles' hot-shot back Tommy Nelson. Nelson

gained a total of 7 yards on eight carries.

In the second half, Dulles had a net offensive gain of zero, gaining one yard passing and having a minus one yard rushing.

Ronny Dennard and Robert Gerasimowicz led the Gators in tackles with 13 and 12, respectively. David Heffron, Bruce Rogers, and Ronny Hudson also had 10 each. Mike Robinson and Dennis Sizemore followed with eight each; Leroy Barrow and Bruce Hobby added seven apiece; and David Cupps grabbed six Vikings.

Rogers and Sizemore also had a fumble recovery, while

Robinson picked off a Viking pass.

Halfback Selden Maltin was the top ground gainer of the game, grinding out 87 yards on 23 carries. Robinson was next with 40 yards on 13 trips.

Dickinson picked up 12 first downs to 7 for Dulles and out-gained the Vikings on the ground 129 yards to 51 yards.

End David Gaffey received a dislocated hip in the contest and will probably be out for the remainder of the season. Wingback David Ford sat out the Dulles contest because of an ankle injury, but he will possibly be ready for the Santa Fe game.
