# Gators Shock SF

Dickinson beat Santa Fe 53-0 Friday night. Those words, minus extra - curricular adjectives, probably are the kindest way to describe the whole dastardly affair.

But to report the whole truth, it could be noted that the Dickinson Gators rushed and passed for 532 yards total offense while holding the Santa Fe Indians to 26 yards total offense.

The kindly officials stepped off 90 yards against the Gators

in penalties but that didn't seem to help much either. Coach Bill Ford wasn't a great deal of help, sending in replacements that appeared superior to the original goods.

Dickinson, trampled well in its first three games by Angleton, Sweeny, and West Columbia, finally came to life against Dulles with its first win last week.

The Gators scored nine touchdowns, three on passes, one on a recovered blocked punt in the end - zone and the other rushing.

The game retained some sense of normalcy in the initial quarter with Santa Fe using the quick kick to keep the Gators backed up in the opening stages. The Indians moved to the Gator 34, also, for their deepest penetration of the game in that period. But the heavier (and faster) Gators began to tip the scales as time faded, and with 1:40 left in the period, managed to put their first score on the book. Mike Robinson and Selden Malin sparked the drive. Quarterback Ken Ward kept on the final run. Jimmy Stewart kicked the extra point.

A jump pass over center to Stewart set up the second marker and Malin cleared the center of the line to roam 35 yards for the TD.

The third TD came despite several major penalties. Malin went in for one from 23 yards out but it was recalled but Ward made it stick by tossing to Dennis Sizemore for a 27 yard TD strike.

With one second showing on the clock, Ward hit Malin with a perfect lob and the speedy halfback raced the remaining 25 yards to post the final

indignity before intermission. Mike Botter blocked the extra point try.

In third period play, the Indians went to the air after Rick Arnold recovered a fumble by Robinson (after a pass completion). Le Roy Barrow intercepted for Dickinson and went all the way to score (56 yards.)

The Gators drove 85 yards on their next series, the longest gainer a 28 yard pass to Robinson and 26 yard TD scamper by Malin to cap the effort.

Trailing 38-0, things went completely to pot for the outclassed and outmanned

Indians in the last period. Backed up to their five and trying to get a punt off, Bruce Mobby broke through to block it and Robert Gerasimowics fell on it in the end - zone for another Gator score.

New quarterback David Ford made an appearance for the Gators and proceeded to fill the air with footballs, his first heave connecting for a 60 yard touchdown with Sizemore on the receiving end. Ford bettered this bomb, minutes later, uncorking a 75 yarder to David Cupps. Bill Merchant and Kenny Walls blocked the try for conversion and the Gators took a 58-0 win.
