The fired up Falcons took a 14-0 halftime lead and then completely bottled up the Dickinson's offensive attack with some heads-up defense.

Seldon Malin continued to lead Dickinson ball toters with his output the only impressive effort for the Gators with his five yard per carry average with 26 yards gained on five trys Malin was Dickinson's only flicker of hope for the evening.

Mark Lange was held to only 16 yards gained and Mike Robinson rolled up only 17. Both Gator quarterbacks had their troubles on keepers and were repeatedly thrown for losses.

The two lads, Ken Ward and David Ford, had a rough time of it in the air, also, as they completed only three passes in 19 trys.

ONE OF these completions, a 44 yarder to end Lewis Little gave the Gators their most serious threat of the fog filled night.

Dickinson took the opening kickoff and went to the Falcon 15 before a pass interception by James Green ended the drive.

Lange bulled for one to start things off, Le Roy Barrow gained five, and on third and four Little made his thrilling catch for 44 yards.

This quick thrust to the 15 had Gator fans on their feet with visions of good things to come in their eyes. Two plays later Green picked off a Gator pass and this provide as a sign of bad things to come.

Green returned the ball to the Gator 47 and five plays later Keith Martin hit Thomas Norworthy for a 34 yard scoring pass. Doyle McElvaney booted his first of

five extra points for the evening and the Falcons led 7-0 with 7.21 left in the opening period.

THE FALCONS capped an 86 yard drive which took eight plays with only three seconds gone in the second quarter.

Billy Holmes powered over from the one for this second Channelview counter.

Channelview marked again the first time they got the pigskin in the second half.

This scoring thrust covered 70 yards in seven plays with Martin picking up the final five yards on a keeper.

The Falcons were off and running the next time they took possession in the third stanza. The big play on this play to Danny McGee.

McGEE TOOK it over from the two on a power sweep four plays later and McElvaney again did the honors.

Channelview scored its last time in the final minutes of the last quarter on a three play drive that covered 43 yards.

McGee went up the middle to the Dickinson three on the second play of the series and then he picked up the final two yards on an identical play.

The Falcon defeat in the season finale for both teams left the Gators 5-5 for the campaign while Channelview stands 6-4 for the duration Dickinson ended district play with a 3-2 mark and the Falcons are 4-1.
