## Gators Lose Scrimmage, Face La Marque Sat.

DICKINSON - With little more than a week left before the opening grid-iron contest of the 1968 campaign, coach Bill Ford will take his Dickinson Gators to La Marque this Saturday night to face the Tigers of District 24-AAAA in a controlled scrimmage at 7 p.m.

This will be the second scrimmage of the season for Dickinson who lost the scrimmage held here last week with Boling by a three touchdown to two margin.

The Gators held the Bulldogs to only 38 yards on 19 running plays, but the Boling quarterback riddled the Gator defense for 182 yards and three touchdowns via the airways.

Boling had the ball in the first set of the 5-series of 3down plays. The Bulldogs failed to pick up a first down in either of the first 2 series, but the Boling quarterback finally got on target in the third series with a 34 yard pass to set up his TD toss of 21 yards two plays later.

In the fourth series, Boling netted 2 yards on 3 plays.

However, the fifth series found the Bulldogs picking up their initial rushing first down via 11 yards on 3 ground plays. With the ball on the Gator 49, the Bulldog field general floated a screen pass out to his right and a few seconds later Boling had its second tally of the contest.

All of the above was primarily against the Gators' first team defense.

Dickinson's first team offense then took over. Quarterback Raymond Young fired incomplete on the first play, but fullback Edward Shavers ground out four yards on the next. Young found end Lewis Little open and the Gator end was finally downed on the Boling 28. Tailback Bobby Pawlik gained two to the Bulldog 26, but he fumbled on the following play and Boling recovered to kill the drive.

Young opened the next series with a one-yard fling to Shavers. The Dickinson quarterback then gained four up the middle, and Shavers roamed for 20 yards to give Dickinson a first down on the Boling 35.

Two plays netted one yard, but Young fired to Little again for a 17-yard gainer to the Boling 17. At that point, the ground forces took over.

Pawlik gained 5; then came Shavers with a 3 yard trip to the Boling 9; once again Shavers got the call and hammered out 4 more yards to the Boling

5; and finally Pawlik took it in from that point around left end behind a Shavers' block. The Gators failed to pick up

a first down on either the third or fourth series. However, in the fifth and final series for Dickinson's

first string offense, Pawlik

gained 18 yards on the first 3 plays to put the Gators' in business on the Bulldogs 42.

Shavers lost six, but Young once again went to Little who made a twisting, turning 45yard run to the Boling 3 yard line. Shavers skirted right end for Dickinson's final tally of the evening.

Dickinson's second team defense then came into the contest.

Boling picked up only 3 first downs in the 5 series, but tallied its final score on a 59yard pass play. Steve Bullard stopped one drive with a fumble recovery, and the Gators never let the Bulldogs get inside the Dickinson 40 yard stripe after that 59-yard toss in the 1st series.

The Gators' reserve offensive unit took over to run 3 series of plays.

An 18-yard run by fullback Chuck Bulot high-lighted the first series before Dickinson ran out of downs on the Boling 35.

Quarterback Bobby Thompson started the second series with an incomplete aerial, but found end Carwyn Abraham for a 13 yard gain on the next play.

Bulot got the call on 3 consecutive trips and picked up 17 Tailback Joey Alteyards. more gave the Gators four more yards, and Bulot gained 3 and a first down on the Boling 28.

The drive stalled there as Bulot lost 3 to the 31 and Thompson had three incomplete passes.

Even more Gator reserves got into action in the final series as Ted Roeser took over the quarterbacking chores and Bobby Sam Palermo moved in at fullback.

Altemore gained two to the Gator 42 to start things off, but Roeser was dumped for a four-yard loss by the majority of the Boling defensive line.

A pass from Roeser to Palermo gained 10, and Palermo sped around right end for a 21yard run to the Boling 39. Roeser then fired an incomplete pass, and another Roeser-to-Palermo aerial good for 8 yards.

The coaches decided to end the scrimmage at that point.

Pawlik paced the Dickinson runners with 35 yards on 7 carries, while Shavers was next with 29 yards on 7 carries. Little led the receiving
