

FIVE DICKINSON SENIORS PREPARE FOR CLEAR CREEK- These five Dickinson seniors had fine performances in last week's 12-7 victory over Angleton and should be ready to face the Clear Creek Wildcats at 8 p.m. this Friday night in League City. Kneeling left to right: Robert Gerasimowicz and Raymond Young. Standing left to right: Bobby Pawlik, Edward Shavers and Dennis Cooke. Gerasimowicz is 6'2". 220-pound center-lindbacker; he made the All-South zone team of District 12-AAA last year at both the center and linebacker spots and is the Gators' All-State candidate this year: "Ger" intercepted 3 passes in his sophmore and junior seasons and scored a TD via a fumble recovery in the end zone; and he helped Dickinson stop Angleton last week with 10 tackles. Young is 6'1", 160 pound quarterback; last year he completed 48 of 129 passes for 671 yards and 9 touchdowns, while running one score himself; he has a quick delivery and can easily loft an aerial 50 yards as the "bomb" is one of his favorite passes; and Young set up both Dickinson scores last week with tosses of 17 and 46 yards. Pawlik is 6'1", 170-pound tailback; lettering last season as a defensive back and recovering 3 fumbles and intercepting one pass. Pawlik has been switched to tailback this year and responded by gaining 98 yards on 15 carries in scrimmages against Boling and La Marque and by picking up 131 yards on 19 trips and scoring a TD on a 19-yard run against Angleton last Friday. Shavers is 205-pound, 6'2" fullback; Shavers is another convert to offense, having lettered at defensive tackle last year; in the two pre-season scrimmages he rushed for 62 yards on 15 trips; and in the Angleton game. Shavers gained 66 yards on 12 carries and set up the Gators' first score with a 17-yard pass reception. Cooke is 155-pound, 5'10" wingback-linebacker; in the pre-season scrimmage against La Marque, Cooke picked off a pass and returned it for a TD;
