## Statistics, Play Favored Gators; Fumbles Costly

SWEENY-The clock show-

ed 0:23 left in the fourth quarter. The score was 13-12 in favor of Sweeny. Quarterback Raymond Young pitched back to Chuck Bulot as the Gators operated on the Sweeny 4-yard stripe. Bulot was cracked hard at or near the goal line and fumbled into the end zone and into the hands of a defender as the Sweeny Bulldogs edged the Dickinson Gators, 13-12, despite a fantastic

The boys in blue of Gator coach Bill Ford never quit, although four costly fumbles and key penalties came their way throughout the 2 hour and 45 minute contest.

brief period on that last Gator fumble into the end zone. If Bulot had entered the end zone or crossed the imaginary plane at the goal stripe, then the Gators would have had the winning score.

Dickinson guard Tommy Cooper said, "It was awful close. He was somewhere between the one-and the goal line." End Lewis Little was more emphatic, "He was over and then he fumbled."

An un-identified Sweeny player with large patch over the bridge of his nose and a number of scratches on both arms commented after the game, "Man, were we lucky. I had to go both ways and they

(Dickinson) always kept after us. On that play at the goal line, that guy sure was close.

If he wasn't over, he wasn't far from it."

the Gators all night. Close, but only into the end zone on two occasions. Dickinson failed to score from within the Bulldogs' 7-yard line in the first, second, and fourth quarters.

Dickinson rolled up 336 yards total offense compared to only 189 for the Bulldogs as the Gator defense that was paced by Robert Gerasimowicz, Ronald Thomas, and Bobby Thompson allowed the Bulldogs to drive 49 yards for one score and only 12 yards for their other somewhat cheap touchdown following a bad pass from center on a punt.

Gator quarterback Young had his most productive night as a runner and a passer this season. Young completed 8 of 13 passes for 118 yards and scooted for 78 more yards on 15 carries.

Tailback Carl Woods finally got untracked this week by rolling up 92 yards on 15 trips and scoring one touchdown.

The contest also was marked by the fine pass catching performance of wingback Dennis Cooke who latched on to 3 aerials for 76 yards.

Young was only dumped for losses on two occasions which is a credit to the blocking of guards Allan Welch, Cooper, and Leonard Barajaz, tackles Tommy Godard and Clarence Hall, ends Little and Al Mof-

fett, and center Gerasimowicz.
The Gators took the opening
kick-off and marched to the

yards on 3 carries and Young had 29 yards on 3 trips. The first of the Gator fumbles took place at that point and the night of endless frustrations was underway. In the closing minutes of the first quarter, Sweeny took over on the Gator 49. The Bulldogs picked up 28 yards on 7 plays, a 21-yard pass from quarterback Jodi Duke to split end Eddie Hudson put the winners on the board. Harold Brown booted the PAT with 11:21 left in the first half. Cooke returned the following kick-off 16 yards to the Gator 37. Runs of 8 and 14 yards by Young and an 11-yard pass from Young to Bulot highlighted the drive to the Sweeny 22 before the Gators ran out of downs. On the next play, however, Dickinson defensive end Mike Mills fell on a Bulldog fumble on the Sweeny 28. Tailback Joey Altemore got the call on 4 consecutive plays and moved the ball to the 15. Fullback Edward Shavers gained 3; Young passed to Little for 6 more, and Altemore picked up only two on a fourth down play and once again Sweeny held, this time at their own 4. Six plays later, the Bulldogs were forced to punt and Dickinson took over on the Gator 49. Young fired to Cooke for a 20-yard gainer to the Sweeny 31, but another fumble stopped things there.
