

Gators Host Hitchcock

DICKINSON— After trouncing Channelview, 47-0, last

week, coach Bill Ford's Dickinson Gators will be seeking

their 4th straight win of the season this Friday night when they play the Hitchcock Bulldogs at 7:30 p.m. at Gator Stadium.

Last week, Hitchcock fell to La Marque Lincoln, 26-0. In other District 12-AAA action, Pearland upset La Porte, 27-0, and Alvin was idle.

The Gators have a 3-1 loop mark as does Lincoln, while La Parte is 2-2 and Alvin leads the District with a 4-0 record.

Dickinson's defense played a key role in the Gators' defeat of Channelview as it limited the Falcons to 4 first downs and a minus 31 yards rushing.

Defensive end Mike Mills recovered a pair of fumbles, one for a touchdown, while lineman Edward Shavers paced the tackle chart with 13 tackles. Mark Lussier was next with 12, while Randy Battistoni had 11, and Robert Gerasimowicz was in on 9.

Tailback Bobby Pawlik led the Gator rushers with 105 yards on 10 trips. Those figures upped Pawlik's 8-game total to 557 yards on 113 carries for a 4.9 average.

Pawlik also tallied a touchdown via a 24-yard run and that tied him for the team scoring leadership with Carl Woods with 26 points. Joey Altmore's 8 points moved him into the second spot with 20 points.

Completing 4 of 9 passes for 83 yards and two touchdowns, quarterback Raymond Young increased his totals to 57 completions in 117 attempts for 881 yards and 6 touchdowns. Lewis Little grabbed one of Young's passes for 36 yards and ran his catches to 28 and his receiving yardage to 437.

Woods increased his rushing yardage to 302 yards on 48 carries (6.3 average) via 32 yards on 6 trips.
