

Gators Smash Hitchcock 83-7

DICKINSON — Reserve fullback Chuck Bulot carried the football four times. He gained 110 yards and scored four touchdowns, and therein lies the story of Dickinson's record scoring victory over the Hitchcock Bulldogs here Friday night.

Bulot tallied his four touchdowns in the final period as the Gators smothered Hitchcock 83-7 in a District 12-AAA game. Dickinson stands 5-4 on the season and 4-1 in league action.

Bulot scored his touchdowns on runs of eight, one, 49 and 52 yards in the final period.

The Gators scored 35 points in the opening period. Bobby

Pawlik scored first on a 29 yards run. Carl Woods returned a punt for 48 yards and a touchdown. Then Pawlik passed 14 yards to Dennis Cooke for another. Next

Raymond Young passed 24 yards to Edward Shavers for a score. A little later Shavers added another on a 42 yard run.

After each of the scores, Mark Lussier kept his toe warm booting conversions.

Dickinson was scoreless in the second period, but they slammed in three in the third period. A 17 yard pass from Young to Lewis Little was the first. Then Joey Altemore went 33 yards for another and scored still another on a three - yard pass from Young.

Lussier added conversions after two of the scores. A run for the point after one of the scores was short.

And then came Bulot's fourth period performance. Ted Roeser ran over the two - pointer after one touchdown, while Altemore did likewise on another.

Hitchcock's lone score came late in the last quarter when Otis Haynes intercepted a pass and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. Mike Skains kicked the extra point.

The 83 points scored was the most tallied in a single game by Dickinson High School.
