

Gators Finish Pigskin Season At La Porte

INSON— Although this night's game at La Porte will be the final contest for the senior players, those who will be "going out in style" will continue their scoring pace.

The Gators have roared past four opponents, beat-
ing Highland, 17-7, cracking
Lincoln, 36-20,
Channelview, 47-0 and
Hitchcock, 83-7. In
their contests the Gators
totaled 183 points and
only 34 markers.

Their final action at
La Porte will be

Young has been an effective
all season. Young's
pass last Friday put
him over the 1000 yard mark
in the aerial de-
partment, having completing
passes for 1024 yards
and touchdowns.

Young grabbed 3 passes last
week for 49 yards and one
touchdown and raised his 9 game
total to 31 receptions for
495 yards and 4 touchdowns.
Young a pair of TD's and
last week, junior
Shavers has a slim
lead in the scoring depart-
ment with 34 points. Woods
and Little have totaled 32
points each, while Shavers and
Bulot have 30 points

held Hitchcock to only 47 yards
rushing last week after limit-
ing Channelview to a minus
31 yards the week before.

Clarence Hall recovered a
pair of fumbles and had 10
tackles, while Mark Lussier
and Randy Battistoni led the
tackle list with 14 and 13,
respectively. Linebackers
Welch and Gerasimowicz had
8 each; Shavers was in on 6
tackles, while specialty team
members Eddie David, Lee
Roy Campbell, and Steve Bul-
lard had 4 tackles each.

The Gators have a 4-1 Dis-
trict 12-AAA mark and a 5-4
season record. La Porte has
compiled a 2-3 loop record.

Young still maintains his
lead in the rushing depart-
ment with 629 yards on 120
carries for a 5.2 average.
The strong Gator defense
