Two or three small claims were approved and ordered to be paid, and the remainder of the session was then taken up with the work of dividing the county into school districts.

The following is the division as made:

WHITE SCHOOL DISTRICTS. \

Dickinson Bayou District No. 7—To be included in the following boundaries: Beginning at *the* northeast corner of section 33, Hooper & Wade, Brazoria county, on west boundary, line of Galveston county, thence in a straight line drawn about midway between Clear creek and Dickinson bayou to the southeast corner of the E. Payne survey in Galveston bay; thence southwardly along the bay-shore to Miller Point, the northeast corner of Shoal Point School district; thence with west boundary line of Shoal Point District and Moses bayou to the head of said bayou; thence in a straight line to county line at head of Dickinson "bayou to southwest corner of" section 13, Texas and New Orleans railroad; thence with county lines to northeast corner of section 22, Hooper & Wade, the place of beginning.

Clear Creek District, No. 8—To be included in the following boundaries: Beginning at Southeast corner of Edward Payne survey, on Galveston bay; thence along the bayshore to Harris county line, on Clear creek; thence up Clear creek to west county line; thence with west county line south to northeast corner of section 13, Hooper & Wade; thence on a straight line to southeast corner of E. Payne survey; on bay shore, place of beginning.

COLORED DISTRICTS.

Hubert's Grove School District No. 12—To embrace all of Galveston island west of city of Galveston, consisting of sections 1, 2, 3 and 4, Trimble & Lindsey survey.

Highland Bayou District No. 13—To embrace all of the county of Galveston, except So. Galveston island.

The court then adjourned until 13 o'clock Saturday.
