
#### dedication

#### mr. barker mr. lafleur



mr. lafleur is a man who tries to give each student the best education possible. he is very dedicated to his work and is always ready to listen.






#### juniors select rings


the day had finally arrived!!






#### classes try for top float






#### georgia dues 1972 homecoming queen










#### s-s-s-snow surprises e-e-e-everyone




the winter play. "dinny and the witches," proved to be one




# d.h.s. turns on with 'fox'


#### gators compete in u.i.l. contest

# gators push in 4-a competition


